**1. APOLOGIES & ANNOUNCEMENTS**

The Chair was advised-Cllr Day had phoned Clerk to say he would be late and Cllr Brazier as he needed to leave at 9.00.

**2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST- ITEMS ON THE AGENDA**

The Clerk noted Cllr Henschley role as President of CHFC. He has a non pecuniary interest in matters-member accepted to abstain from voting on all matters connected with CHFC. Being allowed- to remain to offer a viewpoint without suggesting of or bearing due influence to, on the matters debated following on in the agenda items.

**3. MINUTES**

The minutes of the Full Council held on 12<sup>TH</sup> January 2006 were approved and accepted as correct-

**4 MATTERS THE CHAIRMAN MAY BRING BEFORE THE COUNCIL**

The Chairman said that we had a number of important issues to look at but the Clerk had advised the business was light for this meeting and he was determined to move on and not delay if there was little debate necessary.

The following matters were brought before the council

The Clerk advised that a letter had been received from Anne Main MP indicating that funds were available from B&Q for Community Projects-applications by 16<sup>th</sup> March.

A Mr Slaughter had applied for a skip licence on Common Land, a fee of £15 to cover 5 days as SCADC will be invoiced.

**River Colne**

Following the previous meeting the Clerk had contacted the Environment Agency and had arranged a meeting the area inspector on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> February for a river walk, CMS Mr Paxton and Cllr Brazier may also join. The purpose is to look at the condition of the river bank and bed, very weeded and sapling growth. More long term it will need some serious work and maintenance. EA are forecasting little money is available and grants are few and far between



## **5. URGENT BUSINESS AND MATTERS ARISING**

### **5.1 Pre School-Treasure Tots a Parish Council & Community Partnership.**

Cllr Corley gave details of the current situation at the Pre School, the prospects for the next half term were better; some more children were joining at the return. We were now able to accept nursery vouchers from parents- secretary had set up the procedure. There was a parents/committee meeting to be chaired by Cllr Corley at 8pm on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> February at V/Hall.

### **5.2 Coursers Road**

Cllr Brazier said he was still pressing for the restitution of the land and removal of the hardcore. He said that there were people still living in the buildings but it could not be proven, adequately to enforce. The police and highways were being made fully aware of the unlawful caravan's pitch in Roestock Lane. So far they had not acted to move on. The Clerk said that we had not had further approaches from Mr Robb or others to pay the court sums. He gave members details of the situation on caravans in storage.

### **5.3 Police Initiative Meeting & Crime Report**

Cllr Reeves said he was becoming disappointed at the police meetings; the last on the 25<sup>th</sup> January had produced little progress. Cllr Corley was to attend the workshop on 23<sup>rd</sup> February at the Civic Centre; the Clerk said that others could go as well we had five invites available. The Police CDRP figures and reports from SCADC were made available for members. Colney Heath had shown a reasonably low crime record. Note also police launch of Hertfordshire's Policing Policy 27<sup>th</sup> March 10.30 am

### **Designated Public Place Order**

Colney Heath as a Parish could participate in a no alcohol area ban anti-social order, (behaviour) however members considered this was not appropriate or required.

### **5.4 Tyttenhanger Sign**

The Clerk had received a call from Lafarge HO concerning the credits plaque and we are to get details of the logo and typeface for their part of the credits. The Clerk has spoken to planning-an application is to be sent. A £1500 deposit has also been paid.

### **5.5 Vehicle Intrusion and other way-leave issues-Colney Heath Common**

The Clerk asked members to consider over the next few weeks what conditions would be required in their opinion and to offer any suggestions for the formal document.

### **5.6 AGM and APM Date Changes**

The Clerk advised that we are going to have to change the date of the Annual Statutory Meeting to the 11<sup>th</sup> May due to the use of the hall as a Polling Station. The Venue for the Annual Parish Meeting will be on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> April at the Charles Morris Hall starting at 7.30 pm. Table Top presentations and the usual cheese & wine from the host Parish Council for all parishioners.

### **5.7 Hertfordshire Village of the Year 2006**

Invitation to participate, members decided not to enter this year.

### **5.8 Public Works Loan Board Increase in Borrowing Period**

The Clerk had received details of the extension from 30-50 years to have cheap loans for major works on land or buildings. This came into effect from 30<sup>th</sup> January 2006.



## **6 SPECIAL AND NEW BUSINESS**

### **6.1 Smallford Landfill Site Methane Levels Monitoring**

Cllr Crump said that he had chased the HCC agents Lambert Smith Hampton again about results-no conclusive monitoring has taken place. Cllr Crump added that the monitoring had seemingly ceased due to problems in the supply of electricity to the four sheds on the site. Or that was the reason given for the lack of data available.

### **6.2 Vital Villages Plan-& Community Projects.**

The report of the meeting 1<sup>st</sup> February was circulated to members. The Clerk had noted 8 items six of which ran parallel with the Parish Council agendas and suggested there is duplicity. How can this be refocused under one banner. Many of the issues were long term, especially highways matters.

### **6.3 Youth Club**

Cllr Brazier said it is still expected to start although he could not advise a date

### **6.4 Smallford Residents Association**

Reports of large increases of development potential in and around the Hatfield- St Albans corridor, there is a great deal of concern according to Cllr Brazier about the pressure on the already highly populated towns and further pressure on infrastructure.

## **7 FINANCE**

The Clerk reminded members he had re-invested £50,000 in Treasury Reserves to April 3rd at 3.85% fixed for 90 days. He could possibly carry out an additional term investment of the entire precept and manage the cash flow on the above £50,000 until August 2006 if interest rates remain good.

### **7.1 Payments and Income**

The Clerk presented the financial statements showing the expenditure in January is £13475.52 to date this month. Income revenue this month was £0

The Clerk has several questions to be clarified by insurers the responses will be brought to the attention of the members when it is received at a future meeting.

The Auditor had also highlighted Fidelity insurance and Business Interruption which is one of the outstanding questions to be answered.

A report received from Jean Horner was passed to members it said that progress had been good and there was a main hall for hire, badminton, table tennis and a dance studio and meeting room. Gym membership available and a kick-about 5 a side goal. The trust has established a management forum involving Watford YMCA Trestle Theatre St Albans City Youth Football Club, and the Police who co-ordinate activities across the park and for the youth in particular. With the temporary absence due to lack of trained staff for the village club, Cllr Brazier is trying to get youth club started here under YMCA.

Clerk needs to discuss next year work plan with Cllr Brazier-P3 grant available.

**22.1 Public and Community Transport**

No attendance by members of the council on to the LTP Conference on 21<sup>st</sup> January 2006 and therefore no report.

Cllr Corley reported on the Community Bus, the service was continuing on Fridays to Hatfield ASDA on average taking 9 passengers and a new driver had come forward.

### **22.3 Disabled Access to Countryside**

Cllr Brazier has ideas for this project and has requested it be kept on agenda.

### **23.4 General Highway matters-(Area 52 the Colneys)**

Cllr Henchley said he had been indisposed to meet with the officers from Highways Partnership on 31<sup>st</sup> January but they had met and the Clerk reported the meeting. The ditching work as promised in the letter 11<sup>th</sup> January 2006 was started and other works will follow.

Other matters included the fresh invitation from Jim Beanie Parks & Green Spaces Manager at SCADC to view the council software version of mowing-weeding and gully maintenance, a date to be given to the Clerk. (Community Services)

The possibility that Peggy's Path may be eligible for a grant of up to £8000 to make provision for illumination on public safety. Area close to Alban Way.

There was no progress on the High Street re-surfacing; it remains in an extremely poor state of repair. Highways Partnership is not prepared to give a date for works.

Cllr Henchley stated that this must come under a review plan at HCC as part of major road network infrastructure in light of the housing demand in the area by ODPM.

A further notice board will be put up in the lobby for matters connected with the Pre School and other general information. The Clerk had reported one of the hirers allowing smoking in the building, we do not hold insurance for that risk to the employees. The Building is considered a smoke free area.

The mowers and other equipment have been serviced ready and the Clerk is storing them whilst St Marks considers a new area to keep them safe. The place used up to now is considered a safety risk and cannot be used anymore.

### **COUNCILLORS QUESTIONS-AT THE INVITATION OF THE CHAIR**

Cllr Rump asked the Clerk to look into a request from Highfield Hall to fence an area prone to depositing rubbish-letter from Secretary

Cllr Reeves wanted the heating improved in the hall, the Clerk said he had it on all day but as soon as the hall front door is opened by other activities it causes heat loss. He would use the spare electric office heater as a backup in future.

Cllr Corley asked if a bus shelter could be provided for outside the Grange, the Clerk will add this to the next agenda. The Clerk agreed to find some details.

Cllr Day mentioned a water leak in Tyttenhanger, the office to provide contact details

Cllr Henchley mentioned the damage to a number of windows in homes and cars in Tyttenhanger, vandals with a catapult the most likely culprits. Police were aware.

The progress on the pedestrian crossing in Hill End Lane was a general topic believed to be one of Cllr Brazier's noted wish list items.
